

Submission Guidelines

1. **Theme**: The editorial board does not suggest any theme or topic for the volume. All submissions are welcome so long it is related to any contemporary legal issue.

- 2. **All submission in Electronic form**: All contributions have to be submitted in electronic form. It should be processed in MS Office 2007 onwards, Times New Roman font, 1.5 line spacing with a left margin of one and half inches and send to: jolti.editor@gmail.com
- 3. **Hard Copies**: A hard copy without mentioning identity of the author should be sent to the contact address given below. The author's name (and those of any co-authors) and address(es) should appear on a separate sheet and sent in the same post.
- 4. **Covering Letter**: All submission should be accompanied with a covering letter mentioning the title of the paper, name and designation and institution of the author. The author should make a solemn declaration about the originality of the paper and that the same has not been published or submitted for publication elsewhere.
- Communication of Acceptance: The decision on the acceptance of the paper for publication shall be of the editorial board which is final. The decision of acceptance will be communicated to the contributor within six weeks of receiving of the submission.

Style Requirement

- Citation: For citation and references, The Bluebook, A UNIFORM SYSTEM OF CITATION (20th Edn.), should be strictly followed. (Authors may visit freely accessible website of Cornell University Law School: http://www.law.cornell.edu/citation/).
- 2. **Lengthy Quotations and Footnotes discouraged**: Authors should avoid long quotations and keep it at minimum wherever necessary with full and proper acknowledgement with quotation marks.
- 3. **Footnotes**: Lengthy and multi-paragraph footnotes are discouraged. It should mention the page(s) of the source and in cases where a court Judgment is source; the footnote should also mention the paragraph of the judgment in addition to the page number of the Reporter.
- 4. **Websites**: Only authoritative websites may be cited. References to (or citing them in footnotes) Internet sources such as Wikipedia or blogs etc., are discouraged. Further, excessive citations of newspapers are also not encouraged as they reflect poorly on the quality of research.

Terms and Conditions

The authors and submissions should comply with following terms and conditions:

- 1. The submission should be a well-researched /documented one following uniform citation method for footnotes/references given above.
- The submission should be the original work of the contributor and not a compilation of other works. The copyright of others should not be violated. The contributor has to give a declaration as to originality of the work. All submitted papers are run on the anti-plagiarism software, so the contributors must avoid the tendency to plagiarize. It is strongly urged that interested contributors read the plagiarism guidelines before submitting. - 3. The copyright in all articles would vest in Law Centre-1.
- 4. The views adopted from other sources and others' work must be quoted and acknowledged.
- 5. There is a generally prevailing malpractice to adopt other's work together with footnotes. If one is reading from works of an author and that author has quoted yet other books or cases etc., the rule is that the one has to find out each original source. The context of the author might be different. One is not entitled to pick up the footnotes of the other author as also his material. If original is not looked at, you should quote the secondary author and state that the previous author relied on the source as stated in footnotes of previous work.
- 6. Only changing the language of another author amounts to copying and using his work. It is not original writing, it is a copy.
- 7. The Contributor has to cover the risk of being sued for copyright, defamation or contempt and have to agree to suffer the losses if caused by violating copyright or other rights.
